The EBTC FB Group cannot be used to invite others to cycle on private rides. It sure would be great if we could do that way. Unfortunately, any event posted on the EBTC FB Group can be seen as 'club-sanctioned', opening EBTC to liability in the event of an incident/accident. For this reason, the rules posted on the FB Group state: "No promotions or spam. Posting invitations to private rides *or* soliciting donations and sponsorship etc... are not allowed". EBTC encourages sharing on cycling related topics including ride reports and photos from rides including non-club rides, route conditions (construction, repaved sections, etc.), and topics of interest related to

cycling. Members can also sell or request cycling related goods.
