Winter Riding is here again – and more popular than ever! Since weather and riding conditions can change quickly, all winter rides will be 'pop ups'. They'll all be offered close to the ride date. Like all EBTC rides, they'll be in the EBTC ride calendar and will require registration in Karelo.



If you are interested in Pop Up winter rides, you can sign up to receive e-mail notifications whenever a new 'pop up' winter ride is available. E-mails will include a link to register for a ride. That way you won't need to keep checking the EBTC ride calendar! You must register to be on the **EBTC 'Pop Up Winter Rider Mailing List'**.
