EBTC's E-Bike Policy - Rationale for 'Pedal-Assist Only' E-Bikes

Safety during a group ride is best assured if the bicycles used perform in a similar manner. 'Pedal-assist' e-bikes are more similar to 'pedal-only' bikes than 'throttle e-bikes'. This is because power assistance only engages when the bicycle is being pedalled, and a safety mechanism prevents any power before a speed of 3 KPH is attained. E-bikes with a handlebar throttle allow more rapid acceleration from a stop, on flat terrain, and passing up hills. While throttle e-bikes can be useful in some cycling situations, they can pose a risk in group riding with a mix of bikes.

Rider and Ride Leader Updates

The ride season is just around the corner, even though for most, it is more than that, but I just wanted to let those of you who are new to the club, and those who may have returned after a few years away, that there are rides for everyone within EBTC.

2024 Ride Program:

The **Stamina Builder Series** is designed for training, fitness, and fun with faster pace, fewer stops, and more independent riding. It is aimed at riders who wish to embark on a more ambitious ride season, and/or prepare to ride longer rides during



the summer months. The season begins gradually with **Optimum** and **Ultime**, starting at 25 km, and can build to 160 km if the **Enduro** ride is right for you. These rides start mid-April, so consult the ride calendar, but also read the ride descriptions carefully to ensure that this series falls within your abilities and goals. These rides do require a working knowledge of RWGPS (Ride with GPS) which is free with your membership.

The **Social Ride Series** is designed with fitness and fun in mind including shorter distances and a more leisurely pace with more frequent stops, quite often with sweeps so that no rider is left behind. These rides generally begin a little later (May) in the season, so again, consult the ride calendar, read the descriptions carefully as to the type of bike, whether RWGPS is used, so you can find the ride that is right for you.

Pop-Up Rides, Unique Rides as well as **Limited Series Rides** will also appear in the calendar as the season opens. These are the wondrous opportunities to ride the favourites of some of our ride leaders. Each month different rides appear! So, check the ride calendar often to make sure you do not miss out!

The riding season is all about finding the ride that best suits your bike, your level of fitness, your availability, and what kind of "fun" you wish to have. Each ride is led by volunteers who have prepared rides and designed routes for the pleasure of your company! Do support them, and do respect their instructions as their reminders are designed to keep all riders safe within the guidelines of the Alberta Traffic and Safety Act, and EBTC.


