Cycling the Oregon Trail: September 2025 Hans Feldmann, EBTC Member

The 2025 edition of the Pacific Coast trip, Astoria (Oregon) to San Francisco, will offer three cycling trip options.

Option 1 is a 12-day trip from Astoria to San Francisco (September 13-26, 2025), covering 1,250 km and including the Redwoods and Golden Gate Bridge. **Cost: \$3,400**.

Option 2 allows participants to join the first seven days of the trip, cycling from Astoria and arriving in Eureka, CA, on September 20 (750 km, up to 130 km/day), after which they must arrange their own transportation to San Francisco. **Cost: \$2,500**.

Option 3 must find their way to Eureka, CA, on September 20, joining the group for the final five days to San Francisco (510 km, up to 119 km/day), also passing through the Redwoods. **Cost \$1,900**.

Drumheller: The Dinos and Drama Tour, May 23-26 Karen & Norbert Broda, EBTC Ride Leaders

Don't miss out! Registration opens **April 1** for this popular ride, with 18 cycling spots available.

We return for a third year to pedal through the dramatic landscape and unique sites of the Badlands – canyons, a ferry ride, hoodoos, a saloon! The drama isn't limited to the landscape. Once again, we'll be attending the buffet and a live comedic performance of *The Foreigner* at the <u>Rosebud</u> <u>Theatre</u>.

The trip's 'hub and spoke' format covers distances between 36-70 km each of the four days. Several hotels and campgrounds are situated as close as a 2 km cycle from each day's starting point in Drumheller.

With some significant hill climbs and no sag wagon, this trip is suitable for **intermediate** riders. Pedal assist e-bikes are welcome.

This is a 'pay-your-own-way' trip. Participants are responsible for all transportation, accommodation, food/snack and entertainment costs. Non-cycling spouses/friends are welcome to join in the Rosebud Theater evening and Wayne Saloon lunch stops.

Mark your calendar! Registration opens **April 2** in Karelo for a two-day cycling trip in the Fairmont Hot Springs (FHS) area.

As a "pay your own way" trip, participants are responsible for arranging all transportation, accommodation, food/snacks and any other expenses. This is an **intermediate**, social (no drop) ride as there is NO van support and the second day has considerable elevation gain. Each participant is welcome to bring a well-maintained road bike or a pedal assist e-bike. Each day we'll meet up at the designated time and location so we can start together.

Plan to arrive in Fairmont Hot Springs on the evening of May 19 for two days of cycling on May 20 and May 21. You may wish to stay May 22 and do your own thing. Edmonton Bicycle and Touring Club

When Ron Chapman and his wife Chris signed up for the Ride to Conquer Cancer, they joined the Edmonton Bicycle and Touring Club (EBTC) to get some proper training and experience. Now, three years later, Ron is the president of the 33-year-old club that has more than 400 members. With rides almost every day of the week and a welcoming program for new cyclists, the EBTC is a recreational, not-for-profit and volunteer-run group that supports and encourages riders of all levels. "Activities like Cycling 101 make it easy for newcomers to join the group," said Ron.

The Chapmans first joined the Rookie Recreational Rides that are geared to new cyclists. But there are also rides like the Thursday Afternoon Get-A-Ways, which explore the highways north of Edmonton and Ride the Parkland, which takes riders through communities just west of the city. Wednesday's Show and Go Cycling is an easy social ride touring Edmonton's bike paths and quiet residential streets, and Outback rides are designed for all levels of highway riders. More serious cyclists wanting to train for a race take part in Target the Tour each week. This group offers race tips and helps develop the endurance and skills needed to safely participate in a race.

Regardless of the type of ride, spending time together is valued by the EBTC. "We will often stop at funky little places such as a caboose restaurant. One time we rode

to the Edmonton Valley Zoo for their birthday celebration and gotto cut the birthday cake," said Dan Boonstra, a seven-year member. Whether it's ice cream, lunch or coffee, taking a break together is a regular part of EBTC activities.

The club also provides numerous opportunities to enjoy the diverse landscapes of Alberta. Trips like Jasper-Banff, Elk Island-Lamont, Waterton Lakes and Blue River keep members exploring every corner of their home province. The highlight event of the year is the EBTC's Tour de l'Alberta, held annually on the last day of the Tour de France. This non-competitive ride is fully supported and offers five distance options from five kilometres for kids up to 185 km. The event increases awareness of cycling and celebrates Alberta's French heritage by taking riders through some of the province's French communities just outside of Edmonton.
